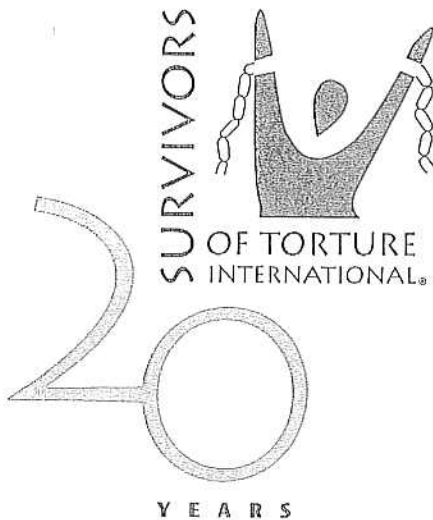

As asylum seekers, these individuals have entered the U.S. legally, seeking safe refuge; however, they are not eligible for health benefits or even the basic necessities, such as food, clothing or shelter while they are awaiting their asylum hearings - a process that takes months and often years.

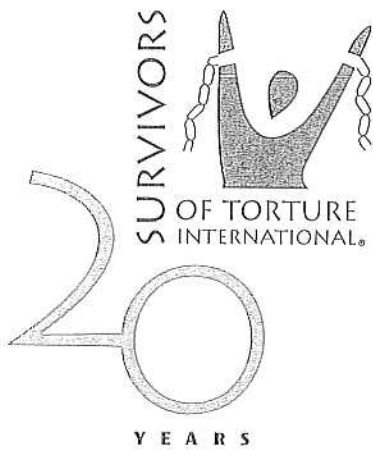

Did you know?

- Over 1.3 million people in the U.S. have survived politically motivated torture abroad.
- There are approximately **35,000 torture survivors living in San Diego County.**
- Most of the torture survivors were **tortured because of their identity** (ethnicity, gender, religion, sexual orientation, etc.) or **because they defended human rights**; some were tortured at random by their government or by members of an opposition group trying to create a climate of fear. Many were professionals or leaders in their homelands.



SURVIVORS has served over 2,000 men, women and children who fled mental, physical and emotional torture.

About Survivors of Torture, International (SURVIVORS)

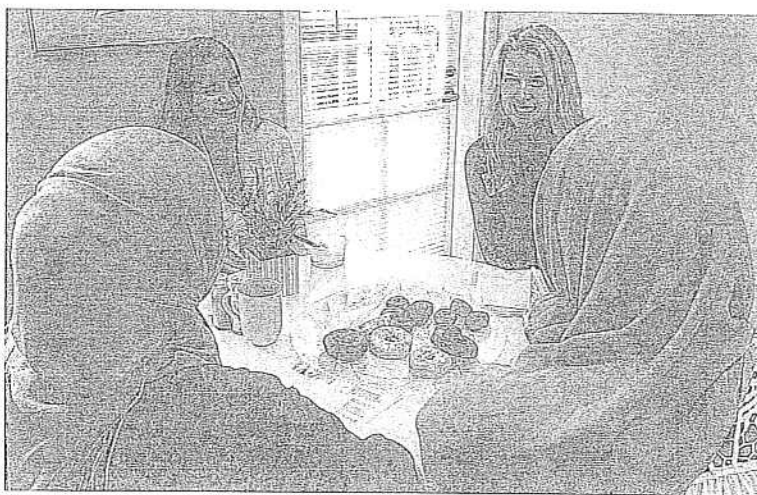
- *Approximately 90 cents out of every dollar that SURVIVORS receives supports client services.*
- Through SURVIVORS' **specialized holistic program**, torture survivors receive medical, dental, psychiatric, psychological, and social services as well as employment, education and legal referrals. SURVIVORS works closely with partners to **empower torture survivors** to once again be **self-sufficient, healthy members of their families and communities.**
- Our mission is to **facilitate the healing** of survivors and their families; **educate professionals and the public about torture** and its consequences; and **advocate for the abolition of torture.**
- Founded in 1997, SURVIVORS is the **only accredited torture treatment center** in San Diego County.

Amina's Story*

Amina was a student at an Iranian university when she was arrested, imprisoned and tortured for participating in one of several student-led peaceful pro-democracy protests supporting freedom of the press. She was detained in a dark, cold and wet cell that was meant to hold 100 people, but held over 250. Over the course of a month, she was psychologically, physically and sexually tortured. Amina was released; however, Iranian police repeatedly summoned her to the station. Each time she was detained for a few days, tortured and released with further threats of harm or death.

Upon release from prison for the tenth time in less than a year, Amina knew she had to flee Iran.

She eventually made her way to San Diego. Her lawyer referred her to SURVIVORS where Amina received a forensic medical exam and a psychological evaluation from a specially trained medical doctor and licensed mental health therapist that proved that she was, indeed, brutally tortured. She also received mental health treatment and medical case management. Her favorite activity was SURVIVORS' Women's Group where she met other torture survivors who spoke of their experiences and hopes for the future. Today, Amina received her California driver's license, something she is very proud of. She is attending college to finish the bachelor's degree in Human Rights she started in Iran and is working part-time.

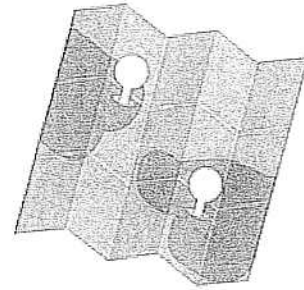
SURVIVORS BY THE NUMBERS

In FY2016, 66% of clients were asylum seekers and 24% were refugees.

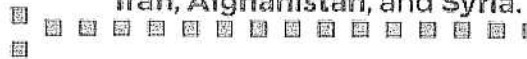

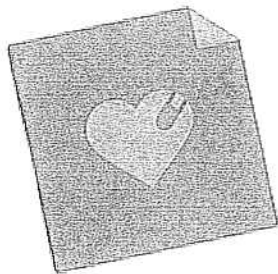
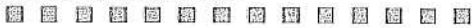
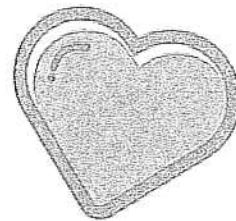
Top countries of origin in FY2016 were Iraq, Mexico, Iran, Afghanistan, and Syria.

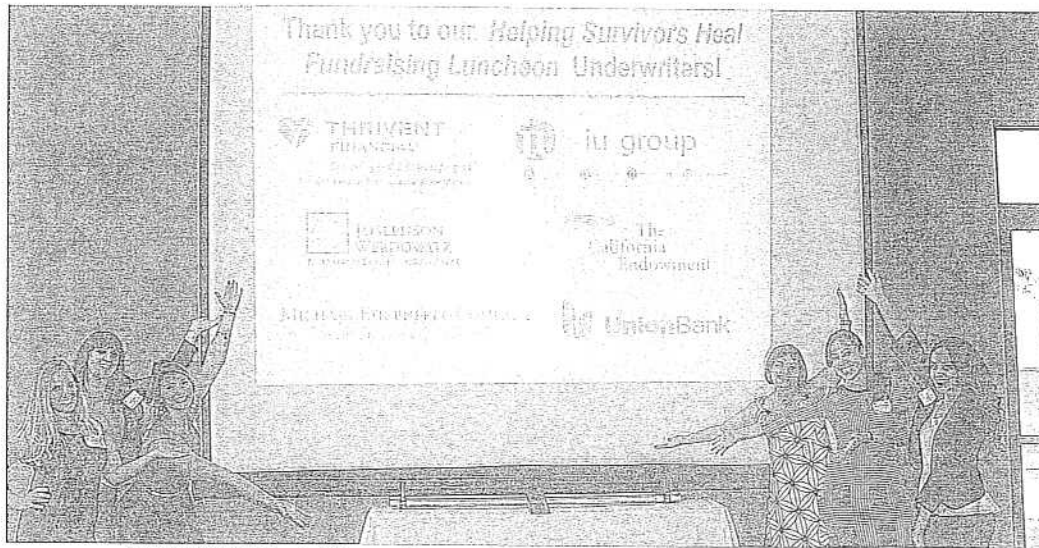

About the “Helping Survivors Heal” Event

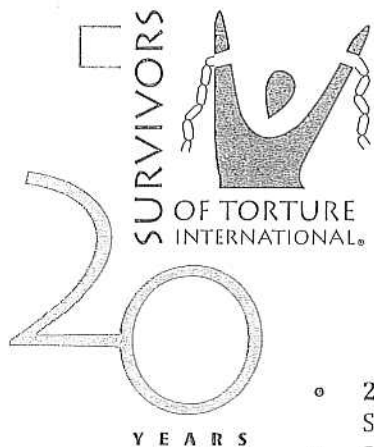
